ESR Section 9.7 Air Quality Page 100		Emissions of carbon monoxide, benzene, 1,3-butadiene, formaldehyde, acetaldehyde, acrolein, and benzo(a)pyrene are expected to decrease for the future (2041) Project full build and Project no build scenarios when compared to the existing (2023) scenario. The decrease in emission rates of these contaminants is a result of advancements in vehicle technology, increased fuel efficiency, and exhaust control efficiency factored in by the MOVES emissions model as the fleet age changes. Overall, the decrease in emissions of these contaminants in the Project full build scenario indicates that the Project is not expected to adversely impact air quality in the Study Area.
